- GILH §84 92 (pp 52-53 of V-1)

- * Nighttime prayer is on a one-week rotation.
- After the Introduction, there is a brief EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE
- Hymn follows Examination of Conscience, and choice given p 1264-1269

- * REMEMBER *liturgically*, Sunday begins at sundown on Saturday night.
- * Therefore, on p 1264, there is Night Prayer after Evening Prayer 1 for Saturday Night
- Prayer begins on page 1264 with a list of hymns

- Pattern of Night Prayer:
- Introduction [God, +come to my assistance...]
- Examination of Conscience
 - Penitential Rite
- Psalmody
- Scriptural Reading
- Responsory

- Gospel Canticle Simeon
 (+) given every night
- Concluding Prayer
- Blessing / Conclusion
 - May the all-powerful Lord grant us a restful night and a peaceful death. Amen
- Antiphon in Honor of the Blessed Virgin

- Start with the Introduction
 - God + come to my assistance, Make haste to help me. Glory to the Father....
- Examination of Conscience
 - Penitential Rite use formula of Mass

- Go to the correct Night p 1264
- NEVER SKIP the Hymn
- Psalmody:
 - Psalm = Antiphon, Psalm, Doxology, Antiphon
 - * Sat and Wed: 2 Psalm sandwiches
 - Other nights, only 1 Psalm sandwich
 - Short Pause after each Psalm and Canticle

- Scripture Reading
- Responsory
- * Short Pause, silence, for reflection

- Gospel Canticle = Canticle of Simeon (+), (Nunc Dimittis)
 - Read story of the Presentation of Jesus at the Temple, and the encounter with Simeon (Luke 2:22-35)
 - Gospel Antiphon
 - Canticle of Simeon (given every night)
 - Doxology
 - repeat Gospel Antiphon

- Blessing, p 674
 - * May the all-powerful Lord grant us a restful night and a peaceful death. Amen
- Close with praying any one of the Antiphons in Honor of the Blessed Virgin (1288 - 1290)

EXAMPLE - Wednesday Night Prayer

- * Start p1280
 - BUT, see in Red, go to $672 \rightarrow$
 - Introduction
 - Examination of Conscience
- Go back to p1280 to continue with Psalmody
- Reading
- Responsory

- * Gospel Canticle of Simeon (+), with Night Antiphon: "Protect us, Lord,..."
- Prayer
- Blessing, p 674
 - May the all-powerful Lord grant us a restful night and a peaceful death.
 Amen
- Close with praying any one of the Antiphons in Honor of the Blessed Virgin (1288 - 1290)
