Pattern of Evening Prayer:

- Antiphon
- Psalm/Canticle
 - Glory to...
- Psalm prayer
- Antiphon

- * Introduction "God (+)
 come to my assistance, Lord
 make haste to help me...
 Amen"
- Hymn
- Psalmody = Psalm, Psalm,
 New Testament Canticle
- Scriptural Reading

- Responsory
- Gospel Canticle Mary, Magnificat (+) (w/ antiphons)
- Intercessions
- Our Father
- Concluding Prayer
- Dismissal

- Liturgically, Sunday begins at sundown on Saturday evening on Sundays and Solemnities
- Therefore, Sundays and Solemnities have 2 evenings:
 - * Evening Prayer 1 on Saturday, after Vigil Mass
 - * Evening Prayer II on Sunday, in evening

- Start with the Introduction if it is NOT your first prayer:
 - God + come to my assistance, Lord make haste to help me. Glory to the Father...
- [OR Start with the Invitatory (See lesson 1) IF Evening Prayer is the <u>first</u> prayer of <u>your</u> day]

- Enter into Evening Prayer
- NEVER SKIP the Hymn



- * Psalmody: Psalm, Psalm, New Testament Canticle
 - Psalm = Antiphon, Psalm, (Psalm Prayer),
 Doxology, Antiphon
 - Short Pause after each Psalm and Canticle



Antiphon

- Go to: Proper of Seasons (title page p119)
 - Note section begins with some Advent season Hymns (pp121 - 136) for the various prayers
 - Prayers begin on p 137 with Sunday, EP I

- Proper of Seasons:
 - Scripture Reading
 - Responsory
 - * Short Pause, silence, for reflection

- Gospel Canticle = Canticle of Mary (+), STAND
 - Read story of the Annunciation and Mary's visit with Elizabeth Luke 1:26 - 56
 - Luke 1:67-80
 - Gospel Antiphon
 - Canticle of Mary, p 669
 - Doxology
 - Gospel Antiphon



- Intercessions
- The Lord's Prayer
- Concluding Prayer
- Dismissal
 - * May + the Lord bless us, protect us from all evil, and bring us to everlasting life. Amen.

* Introduction:

- (+) God come to my
 assistance, Lord, make haste to
 help me. Glory to the Father...
- Evening Prayer, p885
 - Hymn "Let all things now..."
 - Psalmody: Ps 72-I, Ps 72-II,
 Canticle of Revelation
 - * Go to Proper of Seasons, page 240
 - Reading (James 5)

- Responsory
- Antiphon for Canticle of Mary
- p669, Canticle of Mary (+)
- Antiphon for Cant of Mary
- Intercessions
- Our Father...
- Concluding prayer
- Dismissal (May (+) the Lord bless us...)

EXAMPLE: Sunday, Week 1 - p 677, p 137

* Introduction:

- (+) God come to my assistance,
 Lord, make haste to help me.
 Glory to the Father...
- Evening Prayer, p677
 - Hymn on p 126 **OR** "Now thank we all our God ..."
 - Psalmody: Ps 141, Ps 142,
 Canticle of Philippians
 - * Go to Proper of Seasons, page 137
 - Reading (1 Thess 5)

- Responsory
- Antiphon for Cant of Mary
- p669, Canticle of Mary (+)
- Antiphon for Cant of Mary
- Intercessions
- Our Father...
- Concluding prayer
- Dismissal (May (+) the Lord bless us...)

How to Pray the Liturgy of the Hours

step-by-step instructions

- * Nighttime prayer is on a one-week rotation.
- See Instructions on page 671
 - Night Prayer begins p 1164 (with hymns)
- * NOTE: After the Introduction, there is a brief EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE
- Hymn follows Examination of Conscience, and choices given p 1164 - 1168p

- * REMEMBER *liturgically*, Sunday begins at sundown on Saturday night.
- * Therefore, on p 1164, there is Night Prayer after Evening Prayer 1 for Saturday Night
- Psalmody for Night Prayer after Evening Prayer-1 begins on page 1169

- Pattern of Night Prayer:
- Introduction: God (+) come to my assistance...
- Examination of Conscience
- Penitential Rite
- * Hymn (choose pp. 1164-1169)
- Psalmody =
 - 2 Psalms on after EP-1(Saturday nights) and Wednesdays;
 - 1 Psalms on other days

- Scriptural Reading
- Responsory
- Gospel Canticle Simeon(+)
- Concluding Prayer
- Blessing "May the all powerful Lord grant us a restful night and a peaceful death. Amen"
- Antiphon in Honor of the Blessed Virgin (p1188-1190)

- Start with the Introduction
 - * God + come to my assistance, Lord, make haste to help me. Glory to the Father...
- Examination of Conscience
 - Penitential Rite use formula of Mass

- Go to the correct Night p 1619 1648
- NEVER SKIP the Hymn
- Psalmody:



- Psalm = Antiphon, Psalm, Doxology, Antiphon
- Short Pause after each Psalm and Canticle

- * Short Pause, silence, for reflection

- Gospel Canticle = Canticle of Simeon (+), (Nunc Dimittis)
 - Read story of the Presentation of Jesus at the Temple, and the encounter with Simeon (Luke 2:22-35)
 - Gospel Antiphon
 - Canticle of Simeon (given every night)
 - Doxology
 - Gospel Antiphon

- Concluding Prayer
- Blessing, p 673
 - * May the all-powerful Lord grant us a restful night and a peaceful death. Amen
- Close with praying any one of the Antiphons in Honor of the Blessed Virgin (1188 - 1190)

EXAMPLE - Wednesday Night Prayer

- Start p1180
 - BUT, see in Red, go to $671 \rightarrow$
 - Introduction
 - Examination of Conscience
 - Penitential Rite
- * Hymn (choose pp. 1164-1169)
- Go back to 1180
- Psalmody (Ps 31, Ps 130)
- Reading

- Responsory
- * Gospel Canticle of Simeon (+), with Night Antiphon: "Protect us, Lord,..."
- Concluding Prayer
- Blessing, p 673
 - May the all-powerful Lord grant us a restful night and a peaceful death.
 Amen
- Close with praying any one of the Antiphons in Honor of the Blessed Virgin (1188 - 1190)

Pattern of Office of Readings:

- Invitatory or Introduction
- Hymn
- Psalmody = 3 Psalms
- MOVE TO PROPER OF SEASONS:
- Verse
- Scriptural Reading
 - Responsory

- * Non-Scriptural Reading
 - Responsory
- * [Sundays and Solemnities: **Te Deum**]
- Concluding Prayer
- Acclamation

Office of the Readings

- Start with the Introduction if it is NOT your first prayer:
 - God + come to my assistance, Lord, make haste to help me.
- [OR Start with the **Invitatory** (See lesson 2) **IF** Evening Prayer is the <u>first</u> prayer of your day]

- Go to the 4-week Psalter for the Liturgical Week and Day
- NEVER SKIP the Hymn
- Psalmody: 3 Psalms,
 - OR 2 -3 parts of Psalms (ex, 834-835)
 - Psalm = Antiphon, Psalm, (Psalm Prayer),
 Doxology, Antiphon
 - Short Pause after each Psalm

- Go to: Proper of Seasons (title page 119)
 - Verse
 - * Scripture Reading
 - Responsory
 - * Non-Scripture Reading
 - Responsory
 - * Short Pause, silence, for reflection

• IF SUNDAY OR SOLEMNITY: Pray the Te Deum (p1047-1048)

The Te Deum

You are God: we praise you;

You are God: we acclaim you;

You are the eternal Father:

All creation worships you.

To you all angels, all the powers of heaven, Cherubim and Seraphim, sing in endless

praise:

Holy, holy, Lord, God of power and might,

Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

The glorious company of apostles praise you.

The noble fellowship of prophets praise you.

The white-robed army of martyrs praise you.

Throughout the world the holy Church

acclaims you:

Father, of majesty unbounded,

Your true and only Son, worthy of all worship,

And the Holy Spirit, advocate and guide.

You, Christ, are the king of glory,

The eternal Son of the Father.

When you became man to set us free

You did not spurn the Virgin's womb.

You overcame the sting of death,

And opened the kingdom of heaven to all

believers.

To glory everlasting.

Keep us today, Lord, from all sin.


Have mercy on us, Lord, have mercy.

EXAMPLE: Thursday, Week II Advent- p 872, p 233

- * Invitatory, p872: (or Introduction)
 - Lord (+) open my lips...
 - Antiphon (choose proper one from options during the season, p647)
 - Psalm 95, p 648
 - Antiphon
- Office of the Readings, p872
 - Hymn "Our God, our help..."
 - Psalmody: Ps 44-I, Ps 44-II, Ps 44-III

- * Go to page Proper of Seasons, page 233
- Verse
- First Reading (Scripture)
- Responsory
- Second Reading (non-Scripture)
- Responsory
- Concluding Prayer, as in MPsee below, p238, bottom
- Acclamation: Let us praise the Lord, and give him thanks (p653)

Office of the Readings

EXAMPLE: Sunday, Week I Advent - p 681, p 139

- Invitatory p681,
 - or Introduction:
 - * God (+) come to my assistance, Lord, make haste to help me. Glory to the Father...
- Office of the Readings, p681
 - Hymn options
 - Psalmody: Ps 1, Ps 2 Ps 3
 - * Go to Proper of Seasons, page 139
 - Verse

- First Reading (Scripture)
- Responsory
- Second Reading (non-Scripture)
- Responsory
- * Te Deum, p 651
- Concluding Prayer as in MP below, p146
- * Acclamation: Let us praise the Lord, and give him thanks (p653)
