

Guide the beginning of our work, direct its progress, and bring


it to successful completion.

TABLE OF LITURGICAL DAYS ACCORDING TO THEIR ORDER OF PRECEDENCE

- The Paschal Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord.
 - The Nativity of the Lord, the Epiphany, the Ascension, and Pentecost.
 - Sundays of Advent, Lent and the Easter seasons.
- Ash Wednesday
 - Weekdays of Holy Week from Monday up to and including Thursday.
 - Days within the Octave of Easter
 - Solemnities inscribed in the General Calendar, whether of the Lord, of the Blessed Virgin Mary or of Saints.
 - The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed.

 - Sometimes only a little
