

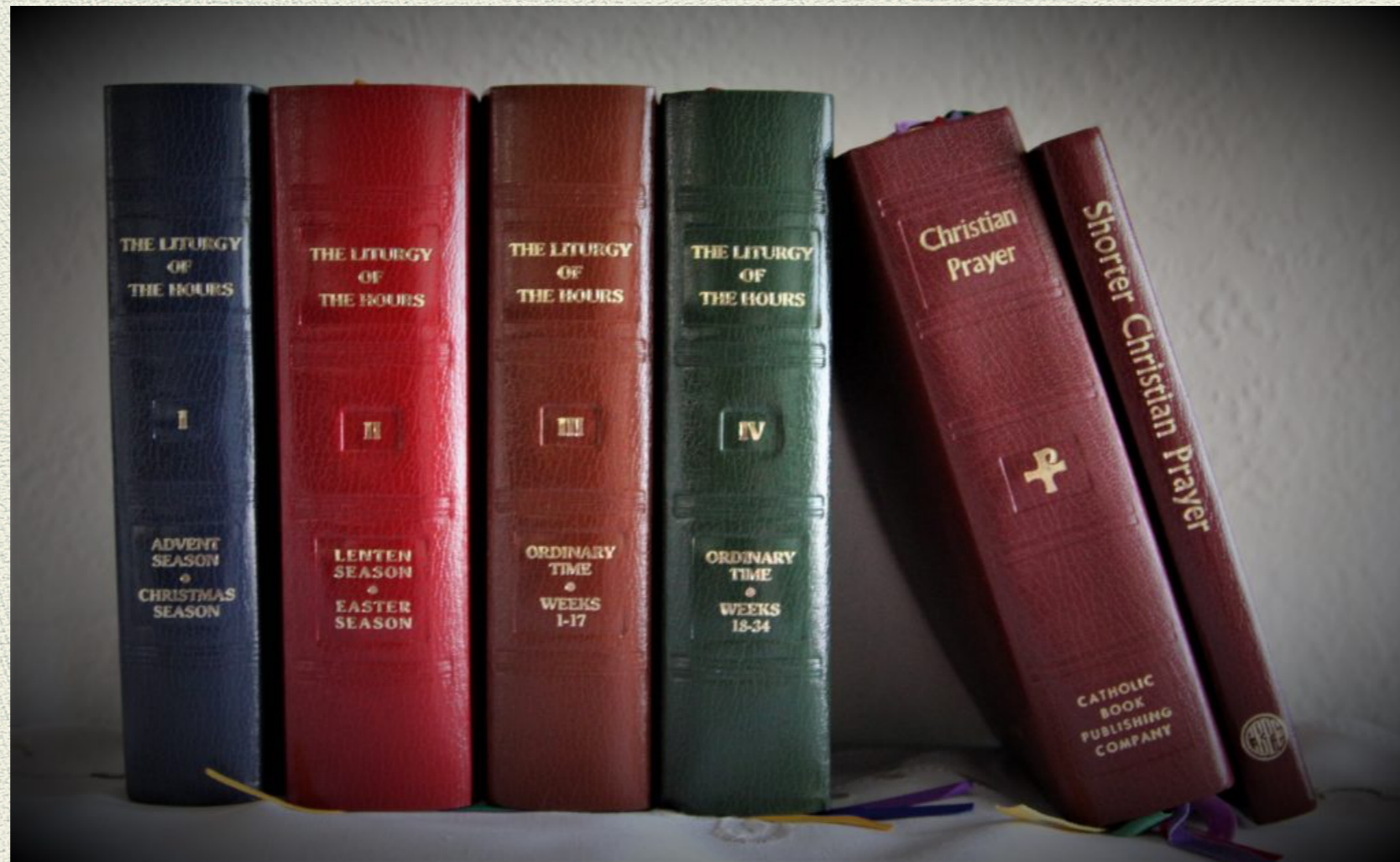

Guide the beginning of our work, direct its progress, and bring it to successful completion.

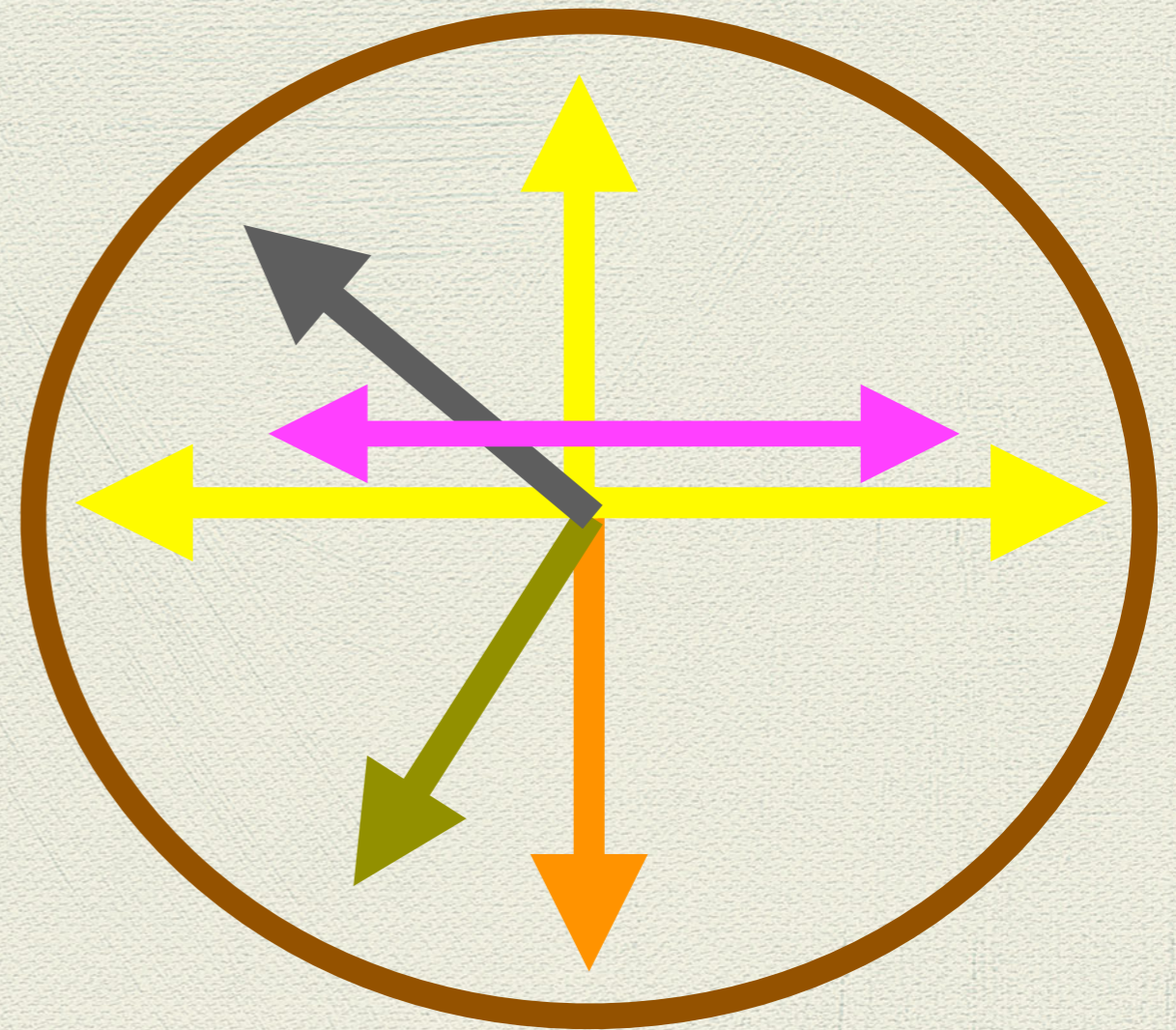
This we ask through Jesus Christ, true God and true man, living and reigning with You and the Father, forever and ever. Amen.

## Back to...Proper of Saints

- ◆ \*\*Gives directions / instructions for the differences for that particular Saint Day
- ◆ Follow the directions of the Solemnity / Feast day — *except otherwise noted.*
- ◆ You will place a ribbon in the day you are praying, and continually return for directions
  - ◆ Sometimes a lot of directions
  - ◆ Sometimes only a little



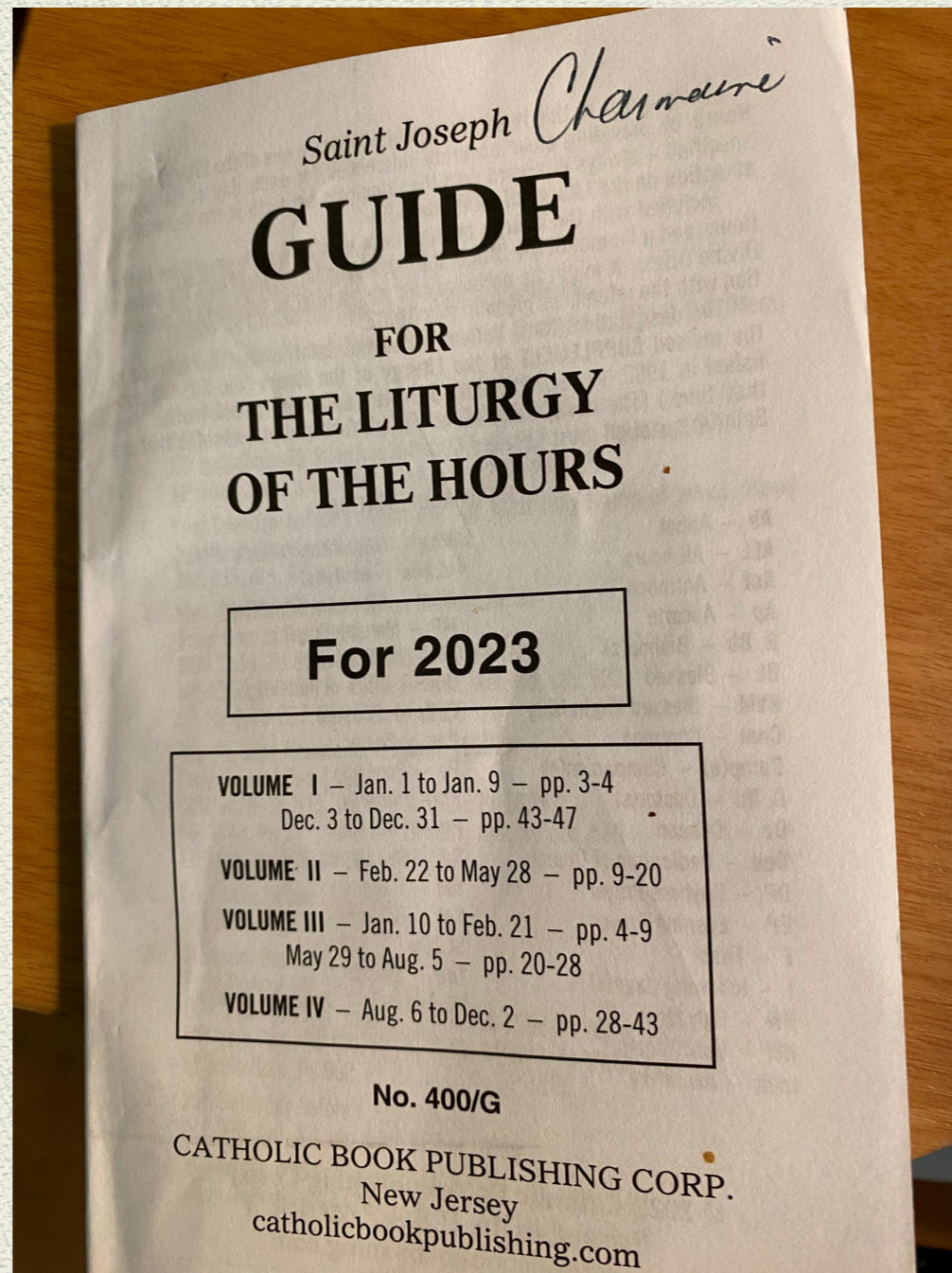
