


CCC §50, By natural reason man can know God with certainty, on the basis of his works. But there is another order of knowledge, which man cannot possibly arrive at by his own powers: the order of divine Revelation. Through an utterly free decision, God has revealed himself and given himself to man. This he does by revealing the mystery, his plan of loving goodness, formed from all eternity in Christ, for the benefit of all men. God has fully revealed this plan by sending us his beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit.

• §68, By love, God has revealed himself and given himself to man. He has thus provided the definitive, superabundant answer to the questions that man asks himself about the meaning and purpose of his life.

 - → and other Church traditions,
- through the Holy Spirit,
- and through Jesus Christ, His Son

Natural Law

- the innate ability to know of his existence,
- and to arrive at a basic sense of good and evil, of truth and falsehood,



- and of the duty to seek always that which is good and true.
- By human reason, we can develop this knowledge of God and of how he wishes us to live.
- Keeping the natural law is ultimately what fulfills us as human persons.


Creation

 "For what can be known about God is evident to them, because God made it evident to them.







The Holy Spirit


- "Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit to "teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you" (Jn 14:26)

— Blaise Pascal 1623 - 1662 (↓39yo) a French mathematician, physicist, inventor, philosopher, and Catholic writer.





The Apostles' Creed

I believe in **God**, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth,

and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Profession of faith The Nicene Creed (325AD) Council of Nicea

- Heresies
- Arius
 - · Jesus is the son of God, BUT he is not divine
 - · Jesus is not co-eternal with God
 - "There was a time when Jesus was not"
 - Jesus is not the same essence
 - Jesus was subordinate to God

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried. and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures.

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the **Holy Spirit**, the Lord, the giver of life,

who proceeds from the Father **[OMIT]**, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.

I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.



Filloque clause, 589

- Original Creed: "proceeds from the Father"
- Toledo revision: Double procession of the Spirit —
 "proceeds from the Father <u>AND</u> the Son"
